Students will then explore scholarships, grants, student loans, and savings plans as means to finance their post-secondary education. This module includes a lesson about scholarship and financial aid scams to ensure that students become savvy consumers. Finally, the students collaborate to create a public service announcement paper slide video about their financial plan for college.

- compose the essay portion of a scholarship application identified in the previous lesson.
- critique and edit the essay portion of a scholarship application for content, clarity, grammar, transitions, and punctuation.
- outline the characteristics of three types of federal educational grants that are available.
- summarize four major characteristics of a college savings plan.
- list ten examples of the types of places they may work when qualifying for the federal work study program.
- evaluate the cost and benefits of obtaining a student loan.
- calculate the recommended amount (if any) of student loan debt based on career earnings potential.
- analyze four types of student loans.
- analyze a primary source document about scholarship and financial aid scams.
- develop a communication tool to explain scholarship and financial aid scams to others.
- organize the information shown on the paper slide video and brainstorm overall themes for the project.
- develop the script and storyboard needed for the paper slide video.
- create graphics needed for the paper slide video.
- rehearse for filming all elements of the paper slide video and begin filming the video.
- finish filing the video and complete any necessary editing.
- present a four-minute, public service announcement paper slide video to the class.

Assessment:

The module includes formative assessments with each lesson and culminates with a summative project. The summative project has the students create a collaborative paper slide presentation to synthesize a financial plan for education.
